

Types of Eligible Expenditures State & Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF)

The <u>Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds</u> (**SLFRF**) program, a part of the American Rescue Plan, delivers \$350 billion to state, local, and Tribal governments across the country to support their response to and recovery from the COVID-19 public health emergency. *Funds must be obligated by December 31, 2024, and fully expended by December 31, 2026.*

The U.S. Department of the Treasury published the <u>SLFRF Final Rule</u>, effective April 1, 2022, and the <u>Overview of the Final Rule</u> in January 2022. The spending parameters of the Final Rule are intentionally broad to provide recipients with significant flexibility in expending SLFRF funds. This guidance authorizes recipients to spend SLFRF awards in several general categories and provides examples of authorized expenditures, including:
