



Foliot Furniture has requested testing's to identify & total Volatile Organic Compound, Formaldehyde & other heavier aldehyde emissions using the ANSI/BIFMA M7.1-2011 method reference.

"Foliot Furniture products qualify for certification following a comprehensive analysis in the ANSI/BIFMA M 7.1-2011 method. Products supplied by Foliot Furniture, for the purpose of analyzing formaldehyde, acetaldehyde and VOC emissions, including the heaviest aldehyde emissions, appear to be excellent products which would most likely meet the stricter CARB standards, that is, 0.05 ppm for formaldehyde, given that the level of emissions was not detectable and, therefore lower than the detection limit of this method, or 0.0007ppm (0.7ppb). The level of total VOC emissions from this product is also much lower than the EMICODE ECI standard or other North-American standards, the limit of which is 500 μg/m3 after a period of 7 to 10 days in the environmental chamber."

1. Introduction

Meubles Foliot requested a proposal from FPInnovations to analyze volatile organic compound (COV) emissions released by bed headboards imported from Vietnam in accordance with the specifications of the ANSI/BIFMA M 7.12011 standard. The test method specified in this standard is the method used to certify furniture. It is the most appropriate method given the type of product in question, namely bed headboards. However, the method was modified to meet the client's information requirements. Measurement of both formaldehyde as well as individual and total COV emissions was carried out three days following the introduction of the bed headboards into the test environmental chamber. This approach differs from the requirements of the furniture certification method (ANSI/BIFMA M 7.12011) standard which requires duplicate sampling and measurement after three and seven days of sample exposure. Moreover, the approach used in this test did not include duplicate sampling and measurements. A single sampling was carried out. The company is particularly interested in knowing the quantity and the types of emissions, including formaldehyde and total VOC emissions emitted by the imported bed headboards. All emitted aldehydes, including acetaldehyde, were quantified in this investigation. VOC quantification was carried out using toluene as a reference compound, whereas formaldehyde and acetaldehyde quantification was carried out with reference to the calibration curves of these compounds.

2. Goal

To quantify individual and total volatile organic compound, formaldehyde and other heavier aldehyde emissions using the ANSI/BIFMA M 7.1-2011 method as reference.

4. Procedure and Results

4.1 Material Delivery Date

Test materials (three bed headboards) were delivered to FPInnovations on October 17, 2013 and stored in the laboratory until their introduction into the environmental chamber.

4.2 Sampling Date

The bed headboards were introduced into the environmental chamber on October 25, 2013. VOC, formaldehyde and acetaldehyde emissions were sampled three days (72 hours) later, on October 28, without prior conditioning of the test materials. Figure 1 shows the arrangement of the bed headboards in the environmental chamber following emission analysis.





Figure 1 – Arrangement of the test bed headboards in the environmental chamber

4.3 Results and Discussion

Test results were measured using electronic equipment. Consequently, they reflect a certain percentage of uncertainty which, however, is within the limits specified by the various testing standards.

Results for individual and total volatile organic compound (IVOCs and TVOCs), formaldehyde and acetaldehyde emissions from bed headboard samples are presented in Table 1 and Table 2 respectively. Table 3 shows the same emissions, but in terms of emission factors.

Results for individual and total volatile organic compounds (IVOCs and TVOCs), formaldehyde and acetaldehyde are expressed in $\mu g/m^3$, representing the mass of the emitted compound or of the total emitted compounds per sampled air volume. It should be noted that individual VOCs as well as total VOCs are expressed in the form of toluene, the calibration curve of which was used to calculate concentration of individual or total compounds. These data can also be expressed in terms of emission factors (in $\mu g/bed$ headboard/hr) representing the mass of the compound emitted, per headboard and per hour. These results are presented in Table 3.

In the case of formaldehyde and acetaldehyde, concentrations are most often expressed in parts per million (ppm) or parts per billion (ppb) when values are very low. In the case of the bed headboard samples, the values for formaldehyde and acetaldehyde emissions range from none to negligible. Indeed, no formaldehyde emissions were detected, and acetaldehyde concentrations amount to only one part per billion (1 ppb).

With respect to the VOC and TVOC values presented in Table 1, it can be said that they are well below the limits recommended by certification agencies such as GreenGuard, ANSI/BIFMA, LEED and others. For instance, the TVOC limit is $500\mu g/m^3$ for office furniture and $250\mu g/m^3$ for office chairs. Preliminary values for the study bed headboards are clearly lower than these values, especially given the fact that they were collected after only 72 hours in the environmental chamber whereas certification data are collected after 168 hours. For these data, the general observed trend is a reduction of emissions compared with values recorded after 72 hours.

5. Conclusion and Recommendations

The bed headboards supplied by Meubles Foliot for the purpose of analyzing formaldehyde, acetaldehyde and VOC emissions, including the heaviest aldehyde emissions, appear to be excellent products which would most likely meet the stricter CARB standards, that is, 0.05 ppm for formaldehyde, given that the level of emissions was not detectable and, therefore lower than the detection limit of this method, or 0.0007ppm (0.7ppb). The level of total VOC emissions from this product is also much lower than the EMICODE ECI standard or other North-American standards, the limit of which is 500 μ g/m³ after a period of 7 to 10 days in the environmental chamber.

On the basis of these preliminary data, Meubles Foliot products would easily qualify for certification following a comprehensive analysis as specified in the ANSI/BIFMA M 7.1-2011 method.


