#### **PROPOSAL FORM 9: IMPLEMENTATION OF HOUSE BILL 1295**

#### Certificate of Interested Parties (Form 1295):

In 2015, the Texas Legislature adopted House Bill 1295, which added section 2252.908 of the Government Code. The law states that a governmental entity or state agency may not enter into certain contracts with a business entity unless the business entity submits a disclosure of interested parties to the governmental entity or state agency at the time the business entity submits the signed contract to the governmental entity or state agency. The commission does not have any additional authority to enforce or interpret House Bill 1295.

#### **Filing Process:**

Staring on January 1, 2016, the commission will make available on its website a new filing application that must be used to file Form 1295. A business entity must use the application to enter the required information on Form 1295 and print a copy of the completed form, which will include a certification of filing that will contain a unique certification number. An authorized agent of the business entity must sign the printed copy of the form and have the form notarized. The completed Form 1295 with the certification of filing must be filed with the governmental body or state agency with which the business entity is entering into the contract.

The governmental entity or state agency must notify the commission, using the commission's filing application, of the receipt of the filed Form 1295 with the certification of filing not later than the 30th day after the date the contract binds all parties to the contract. The commission will post the completed Form 1295 to its website within seven business days after receiving notice from the governmental entity or state agency.

- 1. The disclosure is required for all contracts in excess of \$17,500 that are **not awarded** pursuant to a "fair and open" process (N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.7).
- 2. Due to the potential length of some contractor submissions, the public agency should consider allowing data to be submitted in electronic form (i.e., spreadsheet, pdf file, etc.). Submissions must be kept with the contract documents or in an appropriate computer file and be available for public access. The form is worded to accept this alternate submission. The text should be amended if electronic submission will not be allowed.
- 3. The submission must be **received from the contractor and** on file at least 10 days prior to award of the contract. Resolutions of award should reflect that the disclosure has been received and is on file.
- 4. Any business entity that fails to comply with the disclosure provisions shall be subject to a fine imposed by ELEC in an amount to be determined by the Commission which may be based upon the amount that the business entity failed to report. The enclosed list of agencies is provided to assist the contractor in identifying those public agencies whose elected official and/or candidate campaign committees are affected by the disclosure requirement. It is the contractor's responsibility to identify the specific committees to which contributions may have been made and need to be disclosed. The disclosed information may exceed the minimum requirement. The enclosed form, a content-consistent facsimile, or an electronic data file containing the required details (along with a signed cover sheet) may be used as the contractor's submission and is disclosable to the public under the Open Public Records Act. ### Life Cycle Assessment

#### **Raw Material**

The raw material stage includes extraction from nature, pre-processing and transportation to the gate of Global Furniture Group's manufacturing plants. Transportation from the manufacturer of raw materials to Global Furniture Group facilities are calculated based on mass and distance.

#### Manufacturing

Semi-manufactured materials are transformed into finished products. Waste is source separated in house and transported to designated recycling or waste to energy facilities. Transportation of the scrap is within the scope. Impacts from the scrap in the incineration and landfill are included. The recycling process is out of the scope for this LCA. Energy and process materials consumed within gate to gate scope at the facility are accounted for at this stage, including electricity, thermal energy from natural gas combustion, process water, interplant transportation and process chemicals.

#### Packaging

Cardboard, foam and wood skids are used as packaging materials. The packaging is mostly done manually with hand tools.

#### Use

Grid electricity is consumed in use phase. The power consumption in the use phase is sum of shadow power draw and power consumed for the lifting motion. The environmental impacts of electricity vary depending on the location of customer. 75% of Canadian grid mix and 25% US grid mix is used to represent the geographic location of clients.

#### Transportation

The transportation to the client is estimated by taking an average transportation distance of all orders over the time period of one month.

# End of Life

No primary data is available on the recycle rate of the product at end of life, so average data provided by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Municipal Solid Waste (USEPA MSW) is used. Transportation of the scrap is within the scope. Impacts from the scrap in the incineration and landfill are included. The transformation of the scrap in the recycling facilities is out of the scope for this LCA.

#### **System Boundary**

System boundaries are a set of criteria specifying which unit processes are part of a product system. According to the BIFMA PCR, the life cycle is to be covered from cradle-to-grave, including all industrial processes from raw material acquisition and pre-processing, production, product distribution and storage, use and maintenance, and end-of-life management.

### **Functional Unit**

The selected functional unit for this study is 1 m<sup>2</sup> of FreeFit Height Adjustable Table BWA3060A7HP over 10 years. The footprint of the selected system is 1.16m<sup>2</sup>. This means that 0.86 units of the system is necessary to satisfy the functional unit. For practical reasons, this study will first be conducted for one (1) unit of FreeFit Height Adjustable Table BWA3060A7HP, and impact scores will then be expressed per functional unit.

#### **Data Sources**

Gabi Full US LCI Database: Over 950 cradle-to-gate inventories for commonly used materials, energy supplies and transportation systems with U.S. boundary conditions. Most data are within North America boundary and matches the region of the production activities. Regional data reduces uncertainty and better estimates the primary data.

When datasets cannot be used to directly simulate the material used, environmental product declarations published by other industrial associations or manufacturers are used as reference for dataset selection and modification. The modifications are usually about the geographic location, recycled content or unit of measurement (e.g. convert m<sup>3</sup> to kg). If no GaBi dataset can represent a material even with minor modification, published information from environmental product declarations are directly used towards the environmental impacts.

## **Cut-off Rules**

Mass – If a flow within the product boundary is less than 1% of the cumulative mass of all the inputs and outputs of the LCI model, it may be excluded, provided its environmental relevance is not a concern. Cumulative omitted mass flows shall not exceed 5% of all the mass inputs and outputs.

Energy – If a flow within the product boundary is less than 1% of the cumulative energy of all the inputs and outputs, it may be excluded, provided its environmental relevance is not a concern. Cumulative omitted energy flows shall not exceed 5% of all the energy inputs and outputs.

# Allocation

The utilities within the facility need to be allocated because the utility spent on each product cannot be directly calculated. Mass allocation is chosen for this LCA. Mass allocation is done using the total raw material (including packaging) quantity divided by the total amount of raw material purchased by the facility.

# Life Cycle Assessment Results

### Life Cycle Impact Categories

According to the BIFMA PCR, impacts shall be calculated and reported per functional unit for each life-cycle stage including materials acquisition and refining, production (manufacturing and assembly); distribution and use, and end of life. The following methodologies shall be used regardless of the location of the manufacturer according to the BIFMA PCR.

1. Global warming potential (GWP 100 year) [kg CO<sub>2</sub>-eq.] from most recent version IPCC. Biomass CO<sub>2</sub> emissions shall be reported separately. Reporting short-term (20-year horizon), in addition to 100-year reporting, is encouraged.

2. Acidification potential (AP) [kg SO2 eq. / kg of emission] from TRACI 2.1 for North America

3. Photochemical ozone creation potential (POCP, or "Smog") [kg O<sub>3</sub> eq. / kg of emission] from TRACI 2.1 for North America

- 4. Eutrophication potential (EP) [kg N eq. / kg of emission] from TRACI 2.1 for North America
- 5. Ozone Depletion Air [kg CFC 11-eq kg of emission] from TRACL2.1 for North America

6. Net fresh water usage (kg) (water usage from electricity generation is not included). (Note: 1 kg of water is equal to 1 liter of water).

7. Primary energy demand in total (renewable and non-renewable energy) (MJ).

#### Interpretation

Raw materials account for a significant percentage of the total environmental impacts. The LCA results would be more accurate if primary data is collected for the raw materials. The raw material stage should be the primary target in emission reduction.

Other than working with raw materials, other methods can be considered to reduce environmental impacts of products, like reducing manufacturing utility consumption, reducing or reusing packaging materials and collecting primary information on end-of-life program.

# Per Section 3, ARTICLE 3 – REPRESENTATIONS AND COVENANTS Section 3.3 – Vendor's Promise

Global respectfully wishes to clarify that Global's Federal Supply Schedule (GSA Contract) receives Global's deepest end user discounting. For pricing compliance, and due to different terms and conditions, Global is not mirroring this discount structure.

# Per Section 3, ARTICLE 5 – TERMINATION OF CONTRACT Section 5.1 - Cancellation for cause

Global respectfully requests the following addition:

"Any work-in-progress that is in production at the time of Termination will be completed, delivered and accepted by the end-user. Any orders which have a Global Order Acknowledgement at that time should be considered in-progress. If a PO has not been acknowledged by Global yet, it may be considered eligible for cancellation at the time of Termination."

# Section 5.2 – Delivery/Service Failures

Global respectfully requests the following changes:

"Upon receipt of a written deficiency notice, contractor shall have ten (10) days to provide a satisfactory response to Region 10 ESC. Failure to adequately address all issues of concern may result in contract cancellation. Failure to deliver goods or services within the time specified or within a reasonable time period as mutually agreed upon by the purchasing agent and Vendor, or failure to make replacements or corrections of rejected articles/services when so requested may constitute grounds for the contract to be terminated."



## Section 5.3 – Force Majeure

Global respectfully requests the following additions to the Force Majeure clause: "The term Force Majeure as employed herein shall mean acts of God, strikes, lockouts, or other industrial disturbances, acts of public enemy, orders of any kind of government of the United States or the State of Texas or any civil or military authority; insurrections; riots; epidemics; pandemics; landslides; lightning; earthquakes; fires; hurricanes; storms; floods; washouts; droughts; arrests; restraint of government and people; civil disturbances; explosions, breakage or accidents to machinery, pipelines, or canals; tariffs; or other causes not reasonably within the control of the party claiming such inability.

It is understood and agreed that the settlement of strikes and lockouts shall be entirely within the discretion of the party having the difficulty, and that the above requirement that any Force Majeure shall be remedied with all reasonable dispatch shall not require the settlement of strikes and lockouts by acceding to the demands of the opposing party or parties when such settlement is unfavorable in the judgment of the party having the difficulty."

# Per Section 3, ARTICLE 7 – DELIVERY PROVISIONS

### Section 7.1 – Delivery

Global respectfully requests the following changes:

"Vendor shall deliver physical materials purchased on this contract to the participating Member issuing a Purchase Order. Conforming product shall be shipped within standard lead times after receipt of an accurate and complete Purchase Order. If delivery is not or cannot be made within the time specified by the Purchase Order the vendor must advise the participating Member of the updated delivery"

Global respectfully requests to strike the last sentence:

"At which time the participating Member may cancel the order if estimated shipping time is not acceptable."

# Section 7.2 – Inspection & Acceptance

Global respectfully requests the following changes:

If defective or incorrect material is delivered, Vendor may have the defective or incorrect products returned or repaired per their standard Returns and Warranty policies, which are enclosed within this proposal.

Global respectfully requests that Global be given a reasonable opportunity to cure/remedy any deficiencies prior to termination. Additionally, Global requests the inclusion of the following return policy:

"No returns of goods will be accepted without written consent and shipping instructions from Global. A minimum re-stocking charge of 35% will be applied to all authorized returns for credit or refund, provided goods are received by Global in the condition in which they left the factory. This may increase depending on the type of product.



Global's Return Goods Authorization (R.G.A.) numbers must appear prominently on all authorized returns. Global will not be responsible for freight costs. No credit will be given if goods cannot be reused as new.

Special order items, non-stock items, and C.O.M. products are not subject to return under any circumstances. All returns must be approved and authorized in writing by Global Customer Service. Global reserves the right to refuse delivery of any unauthorized returns."

# Section 7.5 – Additional Charges

Global requests clarification of delivery charges as follows:

"Unless bought on F.O.B. 'shipping point' and Vendor prepays transportation, no delivery charges shall be added to invoices except for any applicable small shipment handling charges as specified in Supplier's Attachment B response, or as specified when express delivery is authorized and substituted on orders for the method specified in the contract."

# Per Section 3, ARTICLE 8 – BILLING AND REPORTING

### Section 8.1 – Payments

Global respectfully requests the following addition:

"The participating entity using the contract will make payments directly to the awarded vendor or their authorized servicing dealer, in accordance with to whom the member's purchase order was cut."

# Per Section 3, ARTICLE 10 – PRICING AUDIT Section 10.1 – Audit Rights

Global respectfully requests to strike the sentence:

"Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event that Region 10 ESC is made aware of any pricing being offered to eligible agencies that is materially inconsistent with the pricing under this agreement, Region 10 ESC shall have the ability to conduct an extensive audit of Vendor's pricing at Vendor's sole cost and expense."

# Per Section 3, ARTICLE 11 – PROPOSER PRODUCT LINE REQUIREMENTS Section 11.7 – Buy American requirement

Global respectfully requests the following clarification regarding origin and compliance:

"Global's products are primarily manufactured in Canada. As such, they do not meet the Buy America Act requirements. However, under the USMCA (which replaced NAFTA), products made in Canada are to be treated no less favorably than those made in the USA.

• Per USMCA Chapter 2, Article 2.3 regarding National Treatment (page 3 of 71):

'The treatment to be accorded by a Party under paragraph 1 means, with respect to a regional level of government, treatment no less favorable than



the most favorable treatment that regional level of government accords to any like, directly competitive, or substitutable goods, as the case may be, of the Party of which it forms a part.'

• Source: <u>USMCA Agreement</u> This mirrors similar language previously effective under NAFTA."

### Section 13.7 – Subcontracts/Sub Contractors

Global respectfully requests the following addition: "Contractor agrees to pay subcontractors in a timely manner. Failure to pay subcontractors for work faithfully performed and properly invoiced may result in suspension or termination of this contract. Prior to the participating member's release of final retained amounts, the Contractor may be required to produce verified statements from all subcontractors and material suppliers confirming that they have been paid in full for amounts due and owing."

Global warrants that all commercial products are free from defects in material and workmanship, for the life of the product, to the original purchaser. Global will repair or replace, at Global's option, as the sole remedy for any defect covered by the warranty. The warranty applies to products manufactured after March 22, 2016.
